

Kansas Nursing Home Performance Trends ~ Corrected

Kansas Advocates for Better Care (KABC) annually releases information on performance trends in Kansas nursing facilities. KABC tracks and reports information on health and safety compliance in long-term care as a public service. The following is a review of Kansas nursing facility inspection performance trends – good and poor – in meeting defined health and care standards for older Kansans. To compile this list, KABC reviewed the past three health safety inspections for all 344 nursing facilities, long-term care units, and nursing facilities for mental health in the state. Facilities which did not meet the criteria for good or poor performance trends will not appear on the lists.

Positive Performance Trends:

Facilities which:

- Achieved consistent compliance with health and safety standards;
- Zero to five deficient health safety practice citations were issued by State inspectors;
- Were not cited for any deficient practice which caused harm or put a person at risk of serious harm; and
- Maintained this level of performance consistently over the past three annual inspection cycles.

Ten (11) nursing homes in Kansas were cited with 0 to 5 deficiencies over the look back period of the facility's three most recent annual inspections covering 36 to 60 months. Seven (7) of the facilities listed are not-for-profit corporations and three (4) are for-profit corporations. None of the 10 facilities listed were cited for "actual harm of residents", "immediate jeopardy of residents", or "mistreatment of a resident" in the nursing facility.

By contrast, 49 of the 344 nursing facilities in Kansas were cited for *more than 10* deficiencies for non-compliance with health safety requirements required by the State and Federal government. 10 or more deficiencies were cited during the past three annual inspection cycles. 35 of the facilities are for-profit, and 14 are not-for-profit corporations. 41 of the facilities with poor inspection performance trends were cited at a serious level of harm to a resident or for mistreatment of a resident.

Poor Performance Trends:

Facilities which:

- 10 or more deficient health safety practice citations were issued by State inspectors, on each of the facility's three most recent annual inspection cycles;
- Were cited for health safety deficiencies that resulted in 'actual harm' to residents or put them in 'immediate jeopardy' of being harmed, or for "mistreatment of a resident". *In the listing below, these facilities are identified by shaded background.*

Inspection deficiencies noted are taken from data published by Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) survey/inspection reports, and the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). The data is current as of December 20, 2018.

A deficiency is cited by State inspectors when a facility was found to be out of compliance/non-compliant with a regulation required to ensure a resident health and safety. A number of Kansas facilities are cited with 10 or more deficiencies during one inspection cycle (by law 12 months, currently about delayed at 17-24 months), however a facility being cited with 10 deficiencies for three consecutive inspection cycles constitutes a 'red flag'. Inspections are an important source of information about the quality of care elders receive in a given facility. Inspections are conducted by trained surveyors/inspectors. Inspections are the only objective outside look at health safety standards in long-term care facilities.

KABC encourages individuals to look at a number of factors when evaluating a nursing facility as a place to live and receive care. Inspection survey results are one of those factors.

The following list represents 10 Kansas nursing homes with **5 or fewer inspection deficiencies** for each of their **THREE** most recent inspections. *None of these inspection deficiencies cited were for actual harm, immediate jeopardy, or mistreatment. **Bethel Home in Montezuma had three consecutive health/safety inspections with zero deficiencies cited each time.*** Data was taken from deficiency statements on the Kansas Department for Aging & Disability Services and from the CMS Medicare.gov websites. Data is current as of **December 20, 2018**.

Nursing Home Poor Performance Trends

The following list represents **49** Kansas nursing homes with 10 or more deficiencies for each of the **THREE** most recent health inspections. The number of deficiencies here are from the most recent inspection listed. **The range in Kansas is 0 to 40 deficiencies.** The average number of deficiencies in Kansas is 7.7 and the national average is 5.8. **Facilities in shaded lines were cited for actual harm, immediate jeopardy, and/or deficiencies classified by CMS as “mistreatment” of residents during their most recent inspection. 344 licensed** nursing homes (NF/LTCU/NFMH) provide care in Kansas. Data is taken from the deficiency statements on the websites for Kansas Department for Aging & Disability Services (KDADS) and CMS Medicare.gov. Data is current as of **December 20, 2018.**
